# NINETY YEARS OF THE RED BOX

For over 90 years, the Red Box has been a familiar presence in Catholic homes across England and Wales – uniting the vision of Blessed Pauline Jaricot and the missionary initiative of Fr Thomas Jackson MHM.



Born in 1799 in Lyon, France, Pauline Jaricot used to gather Catholics into small groups to pray and give a weekly offering to support missionaries. In 1822, she founded the Association for the Propagation of the Faith (Missio's APF), which was later recognised by Pope Pius XI as the Church's official mission organisation – known today as Missio.

Born in 1844 in Preston, England, Thomas Jackson grew up in a poor family. Despite financial hardship, he pursued a vocation to the priesthood with the Mill Hill Missionaries – which had been founded in 1866 by Cardinal Vaughan. Thanks to the generosity of others, Fr Thomas was able to complete his training which shaped his determination to help future missionaries.

After serving in Afghanistan and Borneo, Fr Thomas returned to England in 1899 and introduced a simple idea: a small collection box, encouraging people to give whatever they could to the work of mission.

In 1936, the Mill Hill Missionaries and Missio's APF united their efforts and adopted a single approach:

**1837**

The Catholic Church in the UK received grants from the APF in Paris of £250,000 between 1837 and 1909

**Early 1900s**

Tea caddies became white wooden boxes depicting mission scenes: the first 'mission box'



**1909**

The UK no longer considered a 'mission territory' and therefore stopped receiving funds from the worldwide APF

**1936**

Missio and the Mill Hill Missionaries combined their fundraising efforts through the Red Box





the Red Box. This partnership continues to flourish, combining prayer and practical support for

missionaries worldwide. In doing so, it fulfils Blessed Pauline Jaricot's vision: supporting the spread of the Gospel throughout the world and Fr Thomas Jackson's commitment to training future Mill Hill Missionaries.

Today, the Red Box remains a quiet but powerful presence in homes: reminding us that even the smallest acts of generosity, offered in faith, can help transform lives across the world.

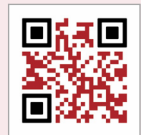


## A symbol of love

# HELPING LOCAL MISSIONARIES OVERSEAS



## The Democratic Republic of the Congo

**In 2025, supporters in England and Wales provided vital support to Mill Hill Missionaries serving struggling communities in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC).**

Fr Patrick MHM needed to build a hostel for 30 vulnerable, war-affected children in Mose – one of the most impoverished villages in eastern DRC; lacking electricity, clean water and basic infrastructure. He explains: ‘In our area, we experience a deep poverty, displacement and a lack of opportunity. Armed groups create fear, families are forced to move and children miss school.

‘Beyond the violence, children grow up without education, stability or hope. Many walk long distances to school, others stop going altogether. Some are orphans or come from families who cannot provide even one meal a day.

**‘This is why the hostel is so important. It is not just a building; it is a response to a crisis. It offers children a safe place to live, study and dream again.’**

While the local community has already contributed financially and is committed to ensuring the sustainability and safety of the project, the building materials needed were beyond their means. Fr Patrick shared: 'The goal is to provide a sanctuary where children can focus on their personal development and education and overcome the hardships they've endured.

**'Education is the only way out of the desperate cycle of poverty. Many war-displaced children in our parish fall prey to anyone who can give them food. In Mose village, motor and taxi drivers often use vulnerable young people, especially girls, for sex, drugs and crime. This results in a high rate of prostitution, juvenile delinquency, sexually transmitted diseases and early pregnancies.**

'Our hostels care for children aged 11 to 17, offering them a stable, nurturing environment during their most formative years. Upon completing their studies, some will return to their villages, ready to embark on new lives, while others may seek work in the capital, Kinshasa. In addition to formal schooling, we provide



life education and language classes in English and French, equipping them with practical skills and boosting their confidence for the future.

'The support from Red Box supporters is not just financial, it is deeply spiritual. It reminds us that we are not alone in this mission. When we receive your help, we see more than a donation; we see faith in action! We see people who choose to share what they have with love. That gives us courage.

**'Your support is already transforming lives: a child who had no bed, now sleeps in dignity; a student who had lost hope, now holds a book again; a young girl who feared for her future, now dares to dream.**

'For us missionaries, your generosity renews our strength. It tells us: *continue, do not give up, the Church is with you.* The hostel has been built with great sacrifice, but it is not yet finished. We still need beds, water systems, solar energy and basic furnishings to make it fully functional for the children.

'Behind every wall of this hostel, there is a story: a child who has lost parents; a family that cannot afford school; a future that is uncertain.

**'You have already begun something beautiful here. But we ask you: *please help us to complete it.* When you support this project, you are not just giving money, you are giving a child a future.**

'And one day, these children will not only remember your generosity, they will become the hope of this nation. Thank you once again to you and to Missio for your generous support and trust.'

## THE MILL HILL MISSIONARIES

For 90 years, the Mill Hill Missionaries have been working in partnership with Missio through the Red Box programme in parishes across England and Wales.

There are currently 148 young men studying to become Mill Hill Missionaries throughout the world – 47 Cameroonians, 26 Kenyans, 36 Ugandans, 9 Filipinos and 30 Indians who are being formed for mission in MHM Formation Centres in India (35 students), the Philippines (6 students), Cameroon (27 students), Kenya (41 students) and Uganda (39 students).

Mill Hill Missionaries continue to love and serve in the following areas:

**28 parishes in Africa:** Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Kenya, South Africa, South Sudan and Uganda.

**28 parishes in Asia:** Cambodia, India, Malaysia, Pakistan and the Philippines.

# TRAINING FUTURE PRIESTS AND SISTERS



## Malawi

Every year, the global Missio network supports the training of over 24,000 future priests and 8,000 novices by providing young church leaders of tomorrow. The Catholic Church continues to grow across the continent of Africa, including the number of diocesan priests. Many of these priests have been supported through Missio's sponsorship programme.

Fr Daniel, the Rector of St Peter's Major Seminary in Zomba, explained to us: 'Last year was another very challenging year. The cost of goods on our market has become very unpredictable. This has brought uncertainty and made it difficult to plan properly. The local currency is not stable and the impact of the continuous devaluation is being felt,

while the cost of goods on the market keeps on skyrocketing.

'Despite such a sad economic front, and the sacrifices being made by the seminary, the students and their families, we are joyful for the continued growth of vocations, as testified by the huge numbers of young men wanting to study for priesthood. In this last academic year, we have had the highest number of seminarians ordained deacons in the seminary's history.'

Brother Valentino, one of the students training for the priesthood and currently being sponsored through Missio, wanted to share this message with you: 'I am grateful for the financial and spiritual support that Missio offers to my seminary formation. Proverbs 11:25 says that "a generous soul will prosper and he or she who refreshes others,

will himself or herself be refreshed". May these words always strengthen you in all the efforts to support our seminary in the work of formation.'

You are contributing towards the support of 1,070 mission dioceses, the training of 24,000 future priests and the education and protection of over 4 million children.



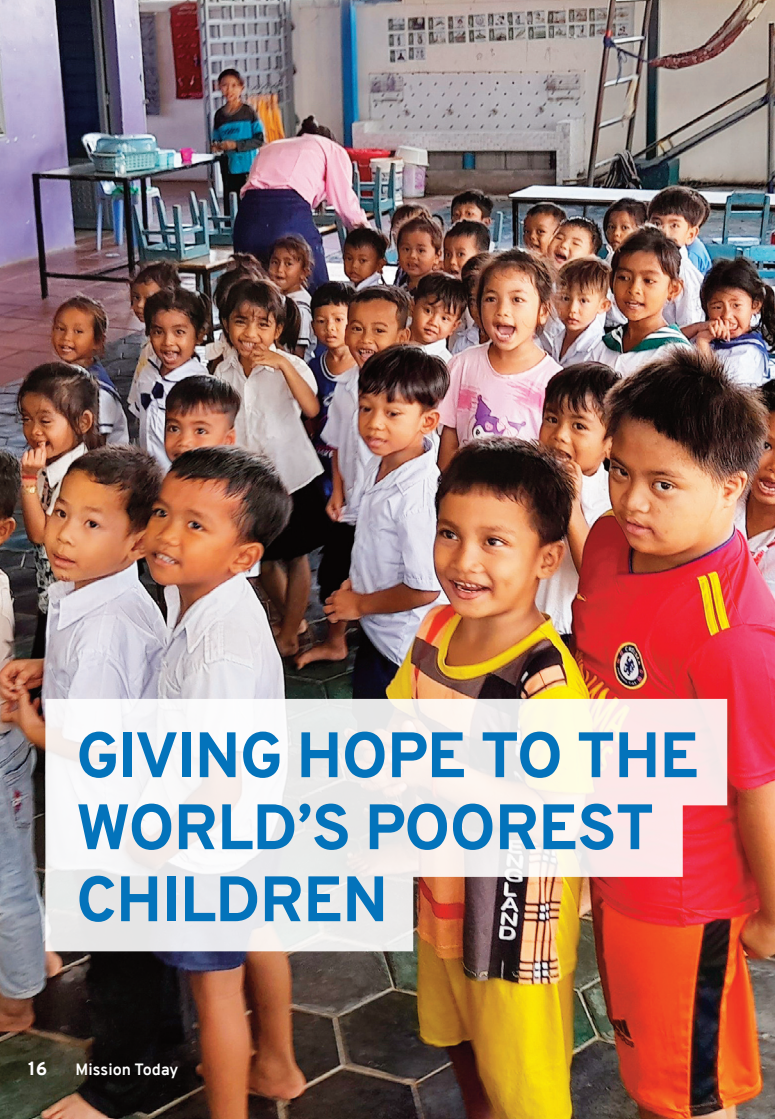

## GIVING HOPE TO THE WORLD'S POOREST CHILDREN

### Cambodia

Since the reintroduction of the Catholic Church in Cambodia – following the devastating civil war and rule of the Khmer Rouge – you have helped re-establish the provision of vital education; opening doors of hope for a better future. One of many projects supported by your prayers and donations is the Sacred Heart Kindergarten, where children whose parents need to work for survival find a safe space to learn and grow.

Fr Paul, a missionary priest and founder of the kindergarten, shares: 'Our purpose is to do everything we can to proclaim the Good News. This means that we try to show that Jesus is a merciful God, who is open to everyone, even if they are non-Catholic. So, when we have activities with non-Catholics, even though we cannot speak of religious ideas, we can share the spirit of love, of mercy, that God loves them.'

As Christians, we all have a mission: to share God's love with the whole world. No one is too young or too small to take part. Through Mission Together, children everywhere pray for and share with one another, in a unique exchange of love and friendship. By praying for one another and sharing what we have, we all belong to God's worldwide family.

## England & Wales

Mission Together is the children’s branch of Missio. Its aim in England and Wales is two-fold: to support essential children’s projects in places of poverty and turmoil, and to support the mission of Catholic education through the creation of free catechetical, liturgical and classroom resources for primary schools.

Nurturing faith and building God’s kingdom is an essential element of Mission Together’s work. All our school resources seek to help children play an active part in God’s global family; working in solidarity for the benefit of all, but with a special concern for those living in poverty.

In addition to our free resources, volunteers for Mission Together visit schools to promote understanding of God’s global family and to encourage pupils to be ‘children helping children’, through sharing and prayer. Thanks to our school supporters and volunteers, thousands of pounds are raised each year to help fund Missio’s overseas children’s projects – such as our work with children in Cambodia.

# NURTURING A WORLDWIDE MISSIONARY SPIRIT

**A central part of Missio's own mission is helping others to understand 'mission' itself. It is a task which we have been given directly by the Pope. The challenge is that mission isn't something that we can learn once. It has to be regularly rediscovered and lived out daily.**

For 90 years, the five-yearly Red Box Appeals in every parish across England and Wales – preached by the Mill Hill Missionaries – have been a vital way in which people deepen their understanding of what it means to be a baptised Christian; which includes developing a missionary spirit.

Our regular Mission Masses and events provide important opportunities for our supporters and volunteers to connect in prayer with missionaries; praying also for our sisters and brothers they work alongside overseas. These occasions are also for our wonderful volunteers (currently over 7,000) to meet one another and hear first-hand experiences from missionaries.

Each October, on World Mission Sunday, the Holy Father invites all Catholics to support Missio – his charity for world mission – through a special collection. This day of prayer, solidarity and giving unites Catholics worldwide to share the Good News of God’s love and the hope which has the power to transform lives.

Every single donation from these worldwide World Mission Sunday Masses supports churches, hospitals, clinics, schools, orphanages and vocations in countries where the Church is new, young or poor.



For 2025, Pope Francis chose the theme ‘*Missionaries of hope among all peoples*’. Through our appeal we invited parishioners to find out more about the work of missionaries in Myanmar as they walk alongside communities that are in great distress due to the ongoing civil war.

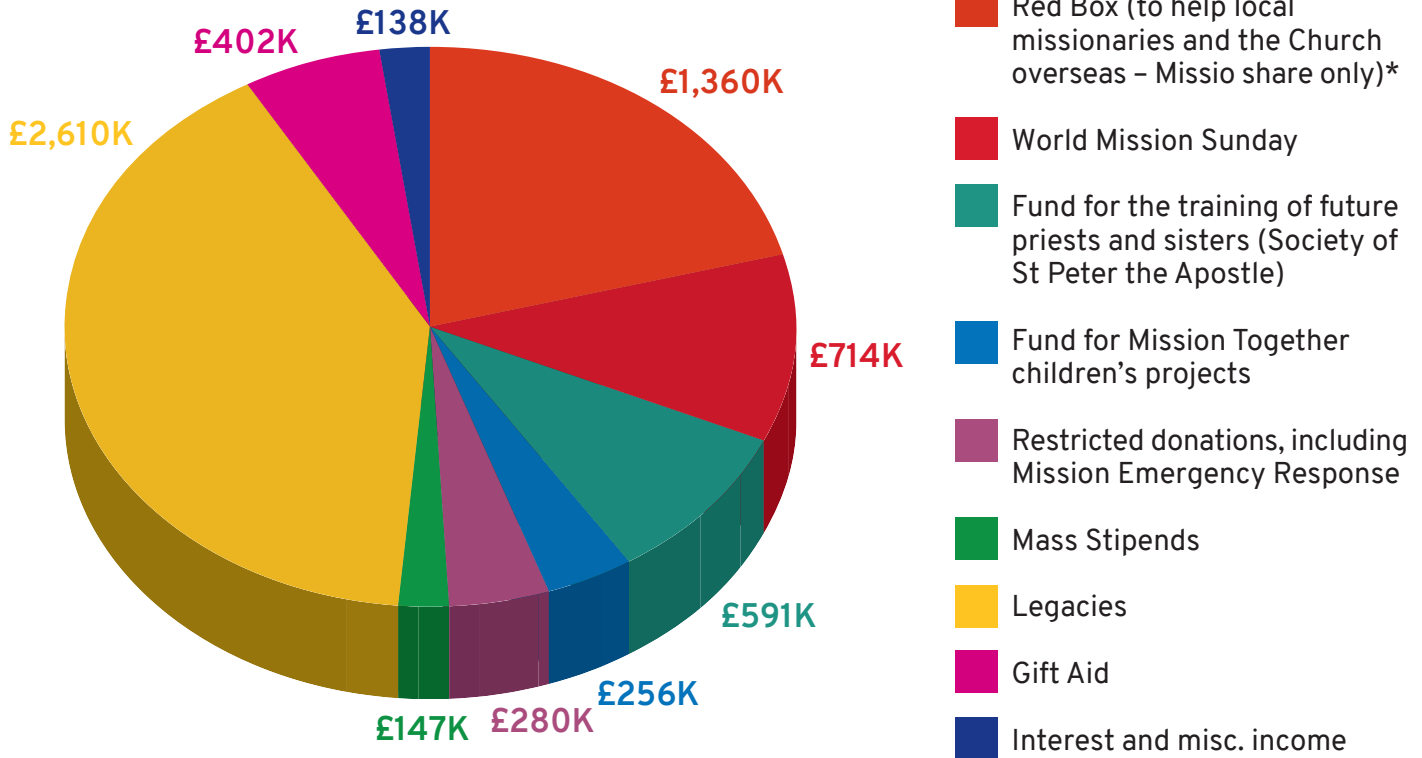
Sr Regina of the Good Shepherd Sisters in Myanmar brings spiritual

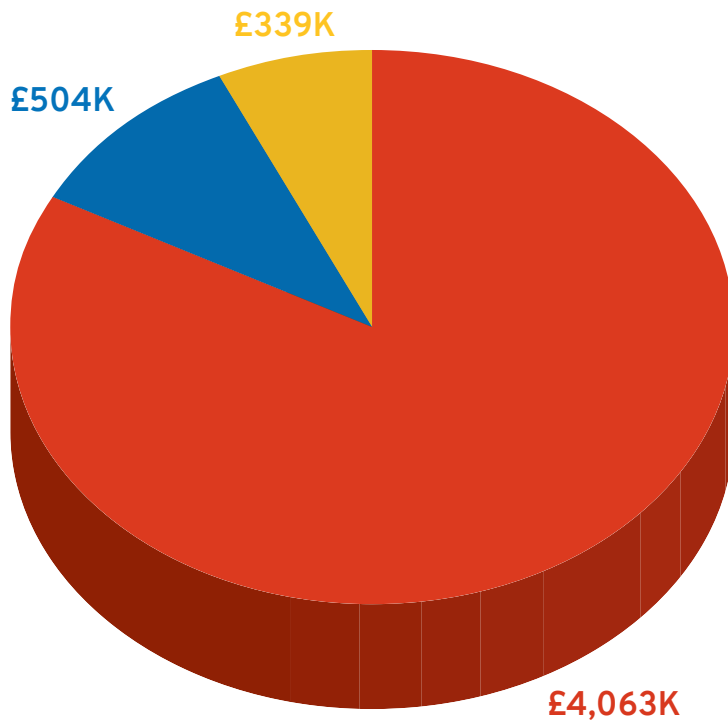


# MISSIO INCOME 2025

Missio also sent **£232K of restricted funding** to support mission projects in DRC, Cambodia, Cameroon, India, Kenya, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, Pakistan and the Philippines for the construction and repair of churches, seminaries and multi-purpose halls and the education of children. Mission Emergency funds were also sent to the Holy Land, India, Myanmar, Pakistan and Sri Lanka.

Missio also sent **£61K** in Mass Stipends to missionaries overseas.

The income from the Red Box is shared 60/40 between Missio and the Mill Hill Missionaries. Missio's share supports missionary dioceses and the spread of the Gospel overseas. For the Mill Hill Missionaries' share, please see the next column.

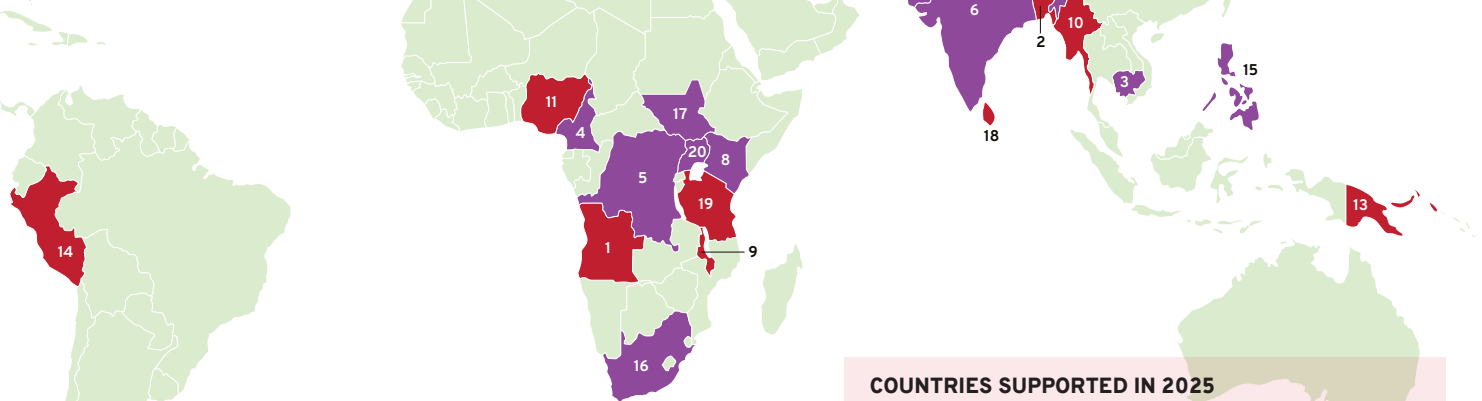
