"A personal encounter with Jesus Christ living in his Church"

Gathering Hymn: Longing for light (Bernadette Farrell)

(Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament as the hymn is sung)

<u>Prayer</u>: God of truth and love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, hear our prayer for those who do not yet know you. That all may come to the saving knowledge of the truth, and that your name may be praised among all peoples of the world.

Sustain, inspire and enlighten your servants who bring the Gospel. Bring fresh vigour to wavering faith; sustain our faith when it is fragile.

Continually renew missionary zeal in ourselves, your Church. Raise up new missionaries who will follow you to the ends of the world. Make us all witnesses of your goodness: Full of love, strength and faith - for your glory and the salvation of the entire world. Amen.

<u>Introduction</u>: One of the first things that Jesus did when he began his public mission and ministry amongst us, was to gather around him men and women who would continue his mission in his name. This first group, the Apostles and Disciples, became the first community of faith, the Church. They lived a common life; were faithful to the Breaking of Bread (Eucharist), the prayers, care of the poor, and witnessed in word and action the faith in Jesus which they professed. Each one, called uniquely by Jesus, needed the support, encouragement and affirmation of the community of believers.

Scripture Reading: Matthew 11:28-30

Reflection:

- Our God is a God of compassion.
- Everyone is welcome into God's consoling presence.
- There is no aspect of my life which I cannot bring to my loving Lord.
- The Lord knows me better than I know myself.
- In his Incarnation, my Lord has embraced humanity completely.
- What has become a "Burden" in my life?
- What provides satisfaction, affirmation and approval in my life?

- Is there any aspect of my life which causes personal dissatisfaction?
- Is there anything that cries out for healing; physical, spiritual or emotional, which the community of faith helps me face?
- How do I experience the support of the faith community, the Church?

Reflection:
