Missio worldwide

In 2020 the global network of Pontifical Mission Societies, of which Missio England and Wales is a part, distributed 130 million US dollars to mission dioceses. We supported Catholic communities in countries where there is poverty, persecution, and political turmoil.

Internationally, 17.5 million US dollars were distributed specifically to fund 2,870 projects for the education and protection of children.

The global network also funded the formation of 24,500 major seminarians; 8,094 novices and the construction of 751 new churches on five continents.

HELPING LOCAL MISSIONARIES OVERSEAS

Pakistan

In 2020, you provided crucial support to poor communities in great need through the Mill Hill Missionaries.

Fr Richard MHM (left) lives and ministers in Pakistan. He shared with us: 'The cost of living in the country has skyrocketed, with many people drifting deeper into poverty. With the pandemic, things are getting worse. If the virus will not kill us, surely hunger will.'

'Many projects were rolled out to provide rations to vulnerable and needy people, but most Christian families were ignored. The Church remained the only hope... but with no income due to closed churches, many families were starving, and many were taking risks to look for food'.

But when Fr Richard received support from you, via the Missio COVID-19 Emergency Appeal, he wrote: ‘There could not have been a better time to get support. Food aid was provided to the starving and most vulnerable people in three parishes run by the Mill Hill Missionaries. Six hundred vulnerable families benefitted from basic food supplies that could allow them to survive for two weeks’.

In April 2020, Pope Francis set up an Emergency Fund through Missio, to help missionaries and young and poor churches through the COVID-19 crisis.

Missio supporters in England and Wales raised £382,000, the majority of which was urgently distributed to 13 countries to help those in greatest need across the world.

With your support through the Red Box, the Mill Hill Missionaries have continued to ‘go where the need is greatest’.

Mill Hill Missionaries in Pakistan are involved in interfaith dialogue; they also minister to terminally ill people and those suffering from drug addiction. Three parish teams are responsible for the evangelisation and pastoral care of desperately poor indigenous families in hundreds of villages where the dominant culture puts pressure on their fragile faith.

Fr Richard tells us: ‘During the pandemic, Christians have been the most affected. The majority work as sanitation workers, as domestic workers, running small-scale business stalls selling vegetables, and as hard labourers in the industries, earning daily wages which are barely enough to meet the family’s needs for the day. Lockdown has meant that they could not work and have no means to take care of their families.

‘The Mill Hill Missionaries would like to thank Missio England and Wales for the support they have offered to the communities we serve, through the Pope’s Emergency Appeal’.



MHM IN NUMBERS

To love and to serve

The Mill Hill Missionaries are an international fellowship of Catholic missionaries dedicated to announcing the Good News of Jesus Christ to people throughout the world. Since 1936, the Mill Hill Missionaries have been working in partnership with Missio through the Red Box programme in England and Wales.

There are currently 181 young men studying to become Mill Hill Missionaries across the world. Thirteen Members were ordained Mill Hill Missionaries in 2020 – five from India, three from Cameroon, two from the Philippines and one each from Uganda, the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Malaysia. We congratulate them and wish them every blessing in their ministry!

The Red Box is a sign of our solidarity with our entire worldwide family. Recently Pope Francis reminded us that solidarity is ‘more than a few sporadic acts of generosity’. It is a mindset which thinks ‘in terms of community and the priority of life of all over the appropriation of goods by a few’.

TRAINING FUTURE PRIESTS AND SISTERS



Cameroon

In 2020, you reached out to seminarians at St Thomas Aquinas Major Seminary in Bambui, where armed conflict continues to rage between the military and the rebel ‘Amba Boys’.

The Rector, Fr Ignatius, shared with us: ‘In 2020, the armed conflict did not disturb us much, except for the times when the gun battles were on the highway that runs right in front of the Seminary. At such times, all the members of the community stayed in the backyard, using the buildings as cover’.

The Seminary was closed in March due to COVID-19, and reopened in two shifts: May for the final year

Theologians, so that they could round off their course, and June for the rest of the seminarians who could then finish up the year.

To ensure safety protocols were adhered to, life in the Seminary was greatly adjusted. The chapel and the hall were organised so that the liturgy and Mass could be held in two locations simultaneously.

Meanwhile the refectory was organised so that the seminarians could eat in two shifts. Only the larger classrooms were used for lectures to maximise distance. Hand washing and sanitisation points were set up and the seminarians needed to wear face masks at all times.

Fr Ignatius also shared: ‘God was really good to us and we were able to end the Formation Year without incident. What we missed were the ordinations that are usually celebrated in the course of the Formation Year. However, both the priestly and diaconal ordinations were done in the various Dioceses’.

Every year, the global Missio network supports the training of over 24,000 future Priests and 8,000 Religious Sisters by providing young churches in developing countries with funding to train their own future church leaders.

Missio continues the work of the Society of St Peter the Apostle (SPA) founded in 1889.

GIVING HOPE TO THE WORLD'S POOREST CHILDREN



South Africa

In 2020, around 30 abandoned and orphaned children living with HIV were cared for at St John's Care Centre, where three Religious Sisters provided a loving home, nutritious meals, and a sense of family.

On a daily basis the children living at St John's Care Centre are provided with a stable environment. There, they are helped to understand the importance of good nutrition, regular medication, and rest – vital to successful treatment of HIV. Social workers also work alongside the Sisters to reunite the children with their relatives where possible.

The Sisters encourage the children to see themselves as members of God's family, with responsibility to love themselves, other people, and

all God's creation. Through Mission Together – Missio's children's branch – they also learn that there are children around the world who care about them, who share with them, and who pray to God for them.

The children are taught by the Sisters to look after one another. As the children are of different ages, they help each other in different ways. For example, at mealtimes the older children help the younger ones by cutting up their food and encouraging them to finish their meals. At the end of the meal, the younger children help to clear the tables.

The Sisters help the children to build a different kind of family at St John's – God's family, to which everyone on earth belongs.

And every morning and evening the Sisters and the children gather for prayers.

Missio supporters have been funding healthcare, feeding programmes, and pastoral care for children and young people affected by HIV/AIDS in South Africa for almost 30 years.

Missio provides spiritual and educational resources for schools in England and Wales which focus on the Gospel, liturgy and on our overseas projects. They help children learn, reflect and stand in solidarity with children around the world living in hardship. In 2020, our most popular resources were adapted for home schooling and we provided as much support as we could to Catholic educators.

NURTURING A WORLDWIDE MISSIONARY SPIRIT

Throughout 2020, we looked at different ways to nurture a missionary spirit online.

Missio responded to the challenges of church closures by providing prayerful, educational and catechetical resources on our website. Liturgical reflections and Masses were also shared via social media, with the aim of supporting the faithful and teachers needing to nurture young people.

During 2020 many of us discovered 'Zoom' for the first time. Although it is not the same as meeting face-to-face, many of you shared that you

valued being able to be together online with other Red Box holders and supporters of Missio.

In Advent, Mill Hill Missionaries and other missionaries reflected with us on the Sunday Gospels. And in the Summer, we delved into the Holy Father's letter on caring for our common home and were inspired by Mill Hill Missionaries in Malaysia, the Philippines and Uganda.

Our Mission Experience Programme and Overseas Priests' Course were postponed due to international restrictions and will resume in 2021.



WORLD MISSION SUNDAY: ‘HERE I AM, SEND ME!’

World Mission Sunday is on the penultimate Sunday in October each year. It is the one Sunday in the year when the entire global Church comes together to support mission. Every single donation from these worldwide Masses supports churches, hospitals, schools and vocations in countries where the Church is new, young or poor.


In 2020, our joyful celebration of our Universal Church was challenged. However, quoting Isaiah 6:8 ‘Here I am, send me!’, Missio reminded people in England and Wales that we are all called to share God’s love.

Missio encouraged the faithful to help missionaries, like Sr Nilcéia, to provide practical care and spiritual nourishment for children and babies in a remote Malawian village.

Sr Nilcéia shared: ‘I want you to know how grateful I am for your support and prayers. The centre of all of this is love. And when you do good, then good remains with you... When we give ourselves for others, we will be satisfied in what we are doing, in what we are. Together we are one family, one faith, one Church, and together we share love through good actions’.




MISSIO INCOME 2020

COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE

In April 2020, Pope Francis set up an Emergency Fund through Missio, to help missionaries and young and poor churches through the COVID-19 crisis.


Missio supporters in England and Wales raised £382,000, the majority of which was urgently distributed to 13 countries to help those in greatest need.

A proportion of this fund was distributed to the Mill Hill Missionaries working in Cambodia, Cameroon, India, Kenya, Pakistan, the Philippines, South Africa, South Sudan and Uganda, so that they could reach out to those most in need in the communities they serve.

*It is Missio's policy to distribute its funds in US Dollars due to the global acceptance of this currency. Cameroon received their allocation in Euros due to a specific requirement for that country.

This information relates to Missio England and Wales.


Today, local Priests and Sisters are building our vibrant Catholic Church of tomorrow, ensuring the gift of faith is passed on to future generations worldwide.

The faithful make an offering, called a stipend, to the Priest in order to apply the Mass to a specific intention, such as an anniversary or birthday.

The offering of a stipend is also a means for Catholics to contribute to the upkeep of the clergy. Many Priests in Africa and Asia depend entirely on Mass stipends for their income.
