You may remember that our Christmas Appeal in 2021 featured Fr Noah, a Mill Hill Missionary (MHM), who lived and ministered in Fundong Parish, Cameroon. Along with the local community, Fr Noah's priority was to provide a safe place to educate children who had been denied an education for so long due to violent conflict.

Today, with Missio's support, Fr Léon MHM is continuing Fr Noah's ministry (see page 8). This is a great example of the long-term nature of Missio's work; because mission



itself is never short-term but requires patience and perseverance, and a great deal of trust in the Lord.

The Church is growing and the needs of so many Catholic communities across the world are increasing. In the present economic climate, we face many challenges, yet we are constantly encouraged by your generosity and the many sacrifices you make to share your blessings with others. On behalf of all who are benefitting from your prayers and giving, thank you!

Another source of encouragement has been the recognition of the spirit of one of our founders. On 22 May 2022 Pauline Jaricot was beatified in Lyon, two hundred years after establishing Missio's Association for the Propagation of the Faith (APF).

Blessed Pauline Jaricot's life teaches us that each and every prayer and penny from you is contributing towards a more just and peaceful world, through the ministry of the Universal Church. Missio worldwide

Missio England and Wales is part of the global network of Pontifical Mission Societies. This network of 120 offices supports Catholic communities in countries where there is poverty, persecution, and political turmoil.

In addition to the support of more than 1,000 mission dioceses, over 14 million US dollars were distributed specifically to fund 2,239 projects for the education and protection of children.

The global network also funded the formation of over 23,000 major seminarians and 7,000 novices, and the construction of over 300 new churches on five continents.







Cameroon

In 2022 you provided essential support to displaced families in the parish of Fundong, in the northwest of Cameroon. Sadly, conflict continues in this part of Africa. Tensions between the Anglophone regions and the rest of Cameroon have been growing for years.

The government's response has been deemed to be entirely disproportionate, with military and the Anglophone 'freedom fighters' now exchanging gunfire daily – terror and brutality abound. The Church is providing refuge to an increasing number of Internally Displaced People who are fleeing the violence and the ongoing threat to their homes, their livelihoods, and their welfare.

Fr Léon, a Mill Hill Missionary who lives and ministers at the St Francis Xavier Catholic Mission in Fundong, recently shared: '...yesterday around 11pm, the military fired bullets just around the market area. One of them got a bullet to the leg and one civilian also got injured by a grenade.

'The "freedom fighters" or "Amba Boys" are disrupting and destroying people's families... They took our students into the forest but thankfully returned them in the evening of the following day. At times, we are accused by the military of cooperating with the Boys, and on the other side, the Boys do the same.'

Despite the turbulence of the ongoing struggle, the Mission Station runs a Missio-supported school and offers a safe space to learn and grow in faith.

Fr Léon's mission is ambitious: to encourage the children to learn in an environment where they will acquire the confidence and skills to face the world with determination; to strengthen the faith of the community – infusing beliefs, values, and standards that the young people will carry all their lives; and to make God known, loved, and served.

This is why Fr Léon set up the Angels Youth Choir, which helps to bring young people into the parish community and attempts to prevent them from being involved in the bloodshed. His aim is to empower them to turn away from the aggression and towards their faith in God.

'The youth in the area are in despair. Some have their school certificates, but they have no jobs. A big number have joined the Amba Boys. This is what motivated me to start the choir group of young people.

'Missio's support has helped us buy instruments, recording equipment and uniforms for the members. We launched the children and youth choir at Mass. The people were so happy to see the children leading the singing. They celebrated!

'Whenever we come together as choir members, we don't just sing. Teachings on faith and morals also take place.

'We continue to be grateful to all the Missio England and Wales supporters. You surely wipe away the tears of many in the world. You bring joy in the lives of many, as Pope Francis says in 'Fratelli Tutti': This is certainly the true and joyful Gospel of Christ, as Christ sends us to "go and do the same" (Luke 10:37). May He continue to inspire you to establish a more just and charitable world.'

The Mill Hill Missionaries are an international fellowship of Catholic missionaries dedicated to announcing the Good News of Jesus Christ to people throughout the world. Since 1936 the Mill Hill Missionaries have been working in partnership with Missio, through the Red Box programme, in parishes throughout England and Wales.

There are currently 178 young men studying to become Mill Hill Missionaries worldwide. Last year, 11 Members were ordained Mill Hill Missionaries – three from Cameroon, three from Kenya, two from India, two from Democratic Republic of the Congo, and one from Uganda. divine wisdom, has illumined your hearts to participate in this very noble mission. Through this endeavour we have become spiritually one in the Lord.



Philippines

In 2022 we continued to be inspired by the Badjao people in the Philippines. This community has been confronted by natural disasters, prejudice, and poverty and yet they rise to these challenges and look to the future with hope.

Most Badjao adults are unable to read or write, so local people openly ignore them, or worse, abuse and actively discriminate against them. They are refused treatment in hospitals and their children are often bullied at school.

For the last four years, your support through Missio has helped this disadvantaged community to access education, healthcare, and training sessions for impoverished children and their parents.

Sister Victoria tells us: 'In times of adversity, we need to be the bearers of the light and give hope to the people... Journeying with the Badjao tribe inspires me to continue the mission of Jesus.'

Today, the Badjao people have 19 graduates working in the private and government sectors. Some graduates have even returned to teach the youth. These adults are a living inspiration for the next generation! Watch this video clip from Manha – a young boy from the Badjao community in the Philippines.



England & Wales

Mission Together is the children's branch of Missio. Its aim in England and Wales is twofold: to support essential children's projects in places of poverty and turmoil, and to support the mission of Catholic education through the creation of free catechetical resources for schools.

In addition to our free resources, Mission Together volunteers also visit schools to promote understanding of God's global family and to encourage pupils to be 'children helping children' through sharing and prayer.

Our school supporters and volunteers raise thousands of pounds each year to help fund Missio's overseas children's projects – such as our work with the Badjao community in the Philippines.

As Margaret Clark, a Local Secretary in Middlesbrough Diocese, said: 'It's an honour to continue the legacy of Blessed Pauline Jaricot: this incredible woman with remarkable faith who, at such an early age, devoted herself to mission, and with female passion created the foundation of Missio which continues today. A great example to us all.'

And it is the network of over 2,000 volunteers who coordinate the Red Box programme in parishes across England and Wales who ensure that the legacy of Blessed Pauline lives on. They also encourage our Catholic community to remember our sisters and brothers around the world, to hold one another in prayer, and to support missionaries and the communities they serve.

This is also a key feature of Missio's resources for schools and parishes: encouraging young people in England and Wales to pray, fundraise, and become missionaries themselves – helping young people in missionary dioceses overseas.





WORLD MISSION SUNDAY:

'You shall be my witnesses... to the ends of the earth'

Each year, Missio is tasked by the Holy Father to coordinate the celebration of World Mission Sunday on the penultimate Sunday in October. It is the one Sunday in the year when the entire global Church comes together to support mission. Every single donation from these worldwide Masses supports churches, hospitals, schools, and vocations in countries where the Church is new, young or poor.


In October 2022 we experienced our shared faith in action, with local parishioners joining Missio in living out and celebrating our call to be witnesses to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8).

The focus of World Mission Sunday was Spanish lay missionary, Maria, and her work with the Meki community in Ethiopia. As Director of the Kidist Mariam Centre, Maria works with an amazing local team to provide a safe, supportive, and educational environment for vulnerable women.

Maria shared with us: 'For me, every person in the Centre is unique... every person is full of joy, full of hopes. And my dream is to see all of them, not only the ones coming here, but even the ones they are inviting; every person coming to the Centre to feel happy and to feel they are doing their best.'




MISSIO INCOME 2022



^{*}This represents Missio's portion of the Red Box income which is shared with the Mill Hill Missionaries.




MISSIO EXPENDITURE 2022

Missio also sent £124,619 of restricted funding to support mission projects in Cameroon, Ethiopia, India, Kenya, Malawi, Nigeria, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, South Africa & Sri Lanka for construction and repair of churches, seminaries, and multipurpose halls; the education of children; Ukrainian refugees and the COVID-19 Mission Response.

Missio also sent £98,591 in Mass Stipends to missionaries overseas.

The income from the Red Box is shared 60/40 between Missio and the Mill Hill Missionaries. Missio's share supports missionary dioceses and the spread of the Gospel overseas, the Mill Hill Missionaries' share supports the formation and training of its future missionaries.
